Creating an inclusive Catholic parish that welcomes people of diverse cultures, abilities, and backgrounds requires intentional efforts in worship, leadership, ministry, and community life, grounded in the synodal practices of listening, walking together, and discerning the Holy Spirit as one community. Here are ways to foster inclusivity:

1. **Cultivating a Spirit of Welcome**

- **Personalised Welcoming**

Creating an inclusive Catholic parish that truly welcomes people of diverse cultures, abilities, and backgrounds requires intentional commitment across worship, leadership, ministry, and community life.

- **Diverse Representation**

Use bulletin boards, websites, and social media to reflect the diversity of the parish through images, languages, and stories.

- **Inclusive Language**

In homilies, announcements, and publications, use language that acknowledges and respects all cultures, abilities, and life experiences particularly groups represented in the parish.

2. **Celebrate the cultures, traditions, and spirituality of Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Peoples**

- **Acknowledge the Land and its Traditional Custodians**

Begin significant parish events by acknowledging the traditional custodians of the land on which your parish is located. For example:

We acknowledge the Traditional Custodians of the land on which we gather, and we pay our respects to Elders past and present. As we come together to worship, we give thanks for their care of this land and commit ourselves to walking together in justice, reconciliation, and peace.

OR

We acknowledge the Traditional Custodians of this land, created by God and entrusted to their care. We honour their Elders past and present, and we recognise the continuing spiritual connection of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples to Country. May the Holy Spirit guide us as we journey together toward healing and reconciliation.

- **Learn and Share Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Peoples History and Culture**

Promote understanding of the history and culture of Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Peoples within the parish community.

Host cultural awareness workshops and educational events led by Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander elders or specialists.

Highlight the achievements and contributions of Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Peoples, including their rich traditions, art, and faith, in parish newsletters or special events.

- **Support Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Peoples Initiatives and Ministries**

Build relationships with local Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander leaders and communities, e.g. support Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Peoples-run organisations, schools, or outreach programs.

Establish or support a reconciliation ministry in your parish that is focused on healing and building positive relationships between the Church and Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Peoples communities. (See Catholic Archdiocese of Perth Reflect Reconciliation Action Plan)

Encourage and invite Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander parishioners to be involved in parish leadership roles and ministries.

- **Cultural Competence in Parish Staff and Volunteers**

Ensure that parish staff and volunteers receive cultural competence training that focuses on the values, needs, and issues facing Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Peoples. (See NATSICC Cross-Cultural Competency in a Catholic Context courses)

If possible, invite Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander elders to speak to the congregation or offer spiritual guidance that acknowledges the unique cultural and spiritual practices of Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Peoples.

- **Create a Safe and Welcoming Space**

Ensure that your parish is an inclusive space for all, where Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Peoples feel welcome to participate in worship and community life. Where appropriate, incorporate Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander artwork, banners, or symbols in the parish space.

- **Encourage Intergenerational Dialogue and Sharing**

Encourage Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander youth to get involved in the life of the parish. This can be through youth groups, education programs, or participation in liturgies.

Host events that invite members of the parish and local Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander communities to share their culture through storytelling, music, art, and food. This promotes mutual respect and understanding.

- **Addressing Social Justice Challenges**

Support and raise awareness about challenges that affect Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander communities.

Stand in solidarity with Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Peoples in advocating for justice, equality, and reconciliation.

Establish outreach initiatives that address the specific needs of some Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Peoples such as food insecurity, lack of shelter, or support services for those in need.

- **Integrate the Church's role in Reconciliation in parish life**

Encourage parishioners to reflect on the Church's role in advancing reconciliation with Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Peoples, and its teachings about healing historical injustices. This may include offering specific prayers, preaching homilies focused on reconciliation, or creating moments of reflection within parish life.

- **Participate in National and Local Celebrations**

Actively engage in and promote National Reconciliation Week, celebrating the ongoing journey of healing and unity.

Organise events during NAIDOC Week (including Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Sunday) to celebrate the history, culture, and achievements of Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Peoples. This can include cultural celebrations or prayer services.

3. **Multicultural Worship & Liturgy**

- **Diverse Music & Prayers**

Incorporate hymns and prayers from a variety of cultural traditions into parish worship as appropriate.

- **Celebrations**

Celebrate feast days and devotional practices that hold particular significance for various cultural communities within the parish, honouring the richness they bring to the Church's shared life of faith.

4. **Accessibility for People with Disabilities**

- **Physical Accessibility**

Ensure the church, parish hall, and toilets are accessible, including:

- ACROD parking, plus Priority Parking for seniors, non-ACROD holders, parishioners with prams etc.
- Ramps and inclusive seating areas that can comfortably accommodate walkers, mobility aids, wheelchairs, and prams.
- Access to the sanctuary for readers, acolytes, altar ministers with mobility challenges.

- **Hearing & Vision Support**

Provide hearing aids, large-print hymn books and screen displays for better visibility. Promote live-stream Mass for those unable to attend in person.

- **Sensory-Friendly Worship**

Offer "quiet Masses" or liturgies that support individuals with autism or sensory sensitivities, creating a prayerful environment where all can participate comfortably.

- **Adaptive Faith Formation**

Provide faith formation and sacramental preparation for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Programs like SPRED (Special Religious Education) can be helpful.

5. Diverse Parish Ministries & Leadership

- **Inclusive Leadership**

Ensure ministries and leadership reflects the diversity of the parish community with consideration for young people to participate with their gifts and talents in leadership and ministry roles.

- **Instituted and Commissioned Ministries**

Support parishioners in their faith, knowledge and understanding in the commissioned and instituted leadership e.g. acolytes, catechists, lectors, sacramental coordinators, children's liturgy teachers. (See CFE – Centre for Faith Enrichment, cfe@perthcatholic.org.au, (08) 9278 0261; CCIL – Centre for Christian Initiation & Liturgy, oci.ccil@perthcatholic.org.au, (08) 9207 3350)

- **Multicultural Ministries**

Support cultural communities in forming prayer groups, celebrating their traditions, and engaging in social outreach as part of the parish's shared mission.

- **Mentorship & Accompaniment**

Assign parish mentors to accompany newcomers, especially immigrants, refugees, and individuals with disabilities. (See PAS - Personal Advocacy Service, admin.pas@perthcatholic.org.au, (08) 9275 5388; WACMRO - West Australian Migrant & Refugee Office, wacmro@perthcatholic.org.au, (08) 9278 0236)

6. Social & Community Outreach

- **Intergenerational Opportunities**

Where possible to provide opportunities that serve the diverse age groups and circumstances represented in the parish e.g. parents with young children, youth groups, newly married couples, older parishioners.

- **Intercultural Social Events**

Organise events such as international dinners, multicultural festivals, or heritage celebrations where parishioners can share their traditions.

- **Support for Immigrants & Refugees**

Provide information regarding legal aid, language classes, or employment assistance through Catholic social services. (See WACMRO - West Australian Migrant & Refugee Office, wacmro@perthcatholic.org.au, (08) 9278 0236)

- **Inclusion of LGBTIQ+ Catholics**

Create pastoral support groups that emphasise the Church's call to accompany all with love and respect. (Catholic Family & Justice Support Services: Program Facilitator – Life Services, lifeservices.cfjss@perthcatholic.org.au)

- **Mental Health & Disability Awareness**

Host workshops and provide resources on mental health and disabilities in light of Catholic teaching.

- **Grief Support**

Accompany those who are needing support due to change, loss and grief. (See Catholic Outreach – www.outreach.perthcatholic.org.au, outreach@perthcatholic.org.au, (08) 9442 7920)

- **Family Matters**

Journey with those facing complex family matters. (Catholic Family & Justice Support Services: Program Facilitator – Life Services, lifeservices.cfjss@perthcatholic.org.au)

Provide training on cultural competency, disability inclusion, and welcoming those on the periphery.
